Practical Nursing Program Plan of Study

The Practical Nursing program at NTC is a one-year Associate of Science degree and is delivered via a hybrid model. Course work and classes are online and asynchronous, so they can be completed any time of day or night – whenever your schedule allows. However, labs and clinicals take place **on campus and in-person** at either Northwest Technical College or one of our local clinical sites, approximately 3-4 consecutive days once per month for the duration of the program.

Practical Nursing Prerequisites

Students must show that they are ready to take a college-level Math and English course. The Admissions Team will help students choose from the following options to meet the requirement:

- ✓ Take a developmental course:
 - o MATH 0081: Math Foundations OR MATH 0092: Intermediate Algebra
 - ENGL 0100: Reading, Reasoning & Writing
- ✓ Score high enough in the Accuplacer Assessment (can be given remotely, or on campus at NTC)
- ✓ Have a high school GPA of 2.6 or higher *IF* high school graduation is within 10 years
- ✓ Have an adequate ACT score in Math and/or English
- ✓ Complete self-placement forms

In addition, students need to be complete or in progress with the following prerequisite courses at the time of their program application:

□ BIOL 2252: Anatomy & Physiology I

- □ HLTH 1106: Medical Terminology
- □ PSYC 2201: Developmental Psychology

Students also need:

□ A Certified Nursing Assistant active within 5 years, or HLTH 1110: Nursing Assistant (or course equivalent) within 5 years

 \Box TEAS score of 53 or higher within 2 years

Once students have completed the TEAS test **and** have completed **or are in progress** with remaining prerequisite courses, they can fill out the <u>Practical Nursing program application</u>. Students will be informed of their admission status approximately 30 days after submitting the program application.
