Admission to the nursing programs at Northwest Technical College follows a separate application process, distinct from general college admission. To be eligible to apply, students must first complete all prerequisite requirements, outlined below as a guide. However, completion of the prerequisites requirements does not guarantee a spot in the program—it only qualifies students for the opportunity to apply.

## **STEP 1:** Students must apply and be admitted to Northwest Technical College

- 1. Apply to Northwest Technical College
- 2. Submit your official high school, GED and/or college transcripts sent directly from the issuing institution to NTC Admissions via mail or by email admissions@ntcmn.edu
  a. International Transcripts MUST be submitted through ECE or WES.
- **3**. Transfer Students undergo a transfer evaluation process to determine prior course equivalency to those offered at our institution.

### STEP 2: Students must demonstrate readiness for college-level mathematics in the following ways:

MATH 0081 Math Foundations <u>or</u> MATH 0092 Intermediate Algebra, or higher within 5 yrs <u>or</u> Accuplacer score: Advanced Algebraic Functions 240 or higher <u>or</u> High school GPA of 2.6 or above IF the student graduated high school in past 10 years <u>or</u> ACT Math score 22 within 5 years or Complete NTC Math Guided Self-Placement Form

# STEP 3: Must complete or be enrolled in the following courses, earn a grade of C or higher & meet GPA.

BIOL 2260 Anatomy & Physiology I – 4 credit
BIOL 2221 Microbiology – 3 credit <u>or</u> BIOL 2262 Anatomy & Physiology II – 4credit *
ENGL 1111 College Writing I – 3 credit
Prerequisite GPA must be <b>2.76</b> or higher when all prerequisites are complete

# **STEP 5:** Complete the Traditional RN Online Application - Separate from the institutional application.

During the designated application window, applicants must complete and submit the Secondary Traditional RN Application online to formally declare their interest in being considered for a specific cohort start.



After completing the prerequisite courses, students pursuing the Traditional RN program may take the general courses listed below. Although these courses are part of the Traditional RN program structure, they may be completed prior to admission to the program.

Please note that taking these general courses before program admission will not accelerate the completion of the Traditional RN program but will help reduce a students overall credit load once in the program.

PHIL 1201 Ethics <u>or</u> PHIL 2210 Bioethical Issues – 3 credit
