Program Description

Our 41-credit Diploma is a one-year hybrid program with a fall start that prepares nurses to provide bedside care and interact closely with patients. Graduates are eligible to apply for licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN). The hybrid delivery model consists of online courses and in-person meetings. Course work online is asynchronous, it can be completed any time of day or night- whenever your schedule allows. Labs and clinicals take place on campus and in-person at either NTC or one of our local clinical sites. Students can plan to be in-person for approximately 3-4 consecutive days twice per month for the duration of the program, approximately 21 days per semester.

General Courses

Northwest Technical College integrates general education courses into the Practical Nursing (PN) program, allowing students to complete them before enrollment to reduce their credit load. However, completing these courses in advance will not shorten the program's duration, as core nursing courses (ADNG) must be taken in a specific sequence by term.

Students planning to pursue the LPN Step-In Program after completing the PN program can also take the general education courses listed below. The LPN Step-In program has its own set of prerequisite courses, and completing these in advance can help with the application process. However, taking these courses early will not accelerate either the PN or LPN Step-In programs—it will only lighten the overall credit load once enrolled.

Anatomy & Physiology Requirement

A total of 8 credits in Anatomy & Physiology is required for the program. This is normally met with BIOL 2260 (4 cr.) and BIOL 2262 (4 cr.). Students with fewer than 8 credits between A&P I and II must complete BIOL 2256 Advanced Physiology (2 cr.) at NTC to fulfill the requirement.
