### PROGRAM INFORMATION

#### BECOME A VITAL MEMBER OF THE DENTAL CARE TEAM.

**Dental Assisting** students gain technical knowledge and manual skills necessary to enter the dental profession as a chair-side clinician, assisting with a variety of clinical functions, laboratory tasks and business office responsibilities. Classroom and hands-on training will prepare students to perform procedures such as exposing radiographs, placing pit and fissure sealants, taking impressions and managing patient records. In addition, labs, internships and service learning activities offer students real-life experiences and interactions with patients and dental health care professionals.

Dental assisting offers a 100% job placement rate as there is currently a shortage of dental assistants in every region of Minnesota.

## FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES

**Graduates of NTC's dental assisting program** will be prepared to become a dental assistant working under the direction of a dentist in general dentistry, dental specialties, orthodontics and oral/maxillofacial surgery.

Dental Assisting graduates enter a growing field of employment opportunities as the need for dental care continues to increase in the United States. Most assistants work with general dentists, although positions are also available with orthodontists, oral/maxillofacial surgeons and other dental specialists. Other employers include public health and government clinics, military dental services, dental schools, allied dental education programs, the retail and wholesale dental industry, and insurance and consulting companies. Dental practices often offer attractive compensation packages and excellent work schedules in a pleasant work environment. Dental assistants work in a variety of settings and have one of the most flexible and in-demand roles on a dental team. A dental assisting diploma takes less than one year to earn with immediate job opportunities available for graduates.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### **DENTAL ASSISTING APPLICANTS MUST:**

- Apply & be accepted to Northwest Technical College:
   » complete application & pay application fee
   » provide all academic transcripts (high school and/or previous college or university)
- If required, complete college readiness courses. Students
  may be required to enroll in college readiness courses in
  reading, writing, and/or mathematics. Enrollment in readiness
  courses is determined by Accuplacer test scores.
- Maintain a C or above in all program-required courses (includes pre- and co-requisite courses).
- Prior to entering the Dental Assisting program, students must successfully complete foundational courses determined by the Accuplacer assessment or be waived from these courses based on courses already taken.
- Current CPR, AHA Healthcare Provider required to be taken fall semester, or transfer of equivalent course and provide current CPR card.
- Vaccinations against Hepatitis B or a signed release form and a Mantoux test.
- Mandatory attendance at an informational meeting during the first week of fall semester.
- Laptop required no Chromebooks or Apple computers as they are not compatible with some program software.

# UPON GRADUATION, TO BECOME A LICENSED DENTAL ASSISTANT IN MINNESOTA, DENTAL ASSISTANTS MUST:

- Pass the national DANB Certified Dental Assistant (CDA) exam
- Graduate from a Minnesota CODA-accredited dental assisting program or Graduate from a CODA-accredited program in a state other than Minnesota and, upon MN Board review of curriculum, complete additional coursework
- Pass the Minnesota Dental Assistant State Licensing Exam
- Pass the Minnesota Jurisprudence Exam
- Apply for licensure to the MN Board of Dentistry
- All licensed dental assistants must maintain a consecutive and current certificate in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) at the BLS level.





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
